
I'm proud to present the 2021 Hastings Police Department Annual Report. The Hastings Police Department is committed to respectful, efficient, and effective service to all who live, work, and visit our beautiful and historic city.

2021 was yet another unpredictable and challenging year. Despite these obstacles, we forged ahead with a focus on building trust and engaging our community. The creation of the Community Engagement Officer position, funded through a Federal COPS grant, enabled to us to focus on homelessness, mental health, and community outreach.

Our staff played a key role in supporting numerous public gatherings such as Police Week Public Safety Night in Downtown Hastings, Historic Hastings Car Shows, Rivertown Days, PRIDE Parade, Rivertown Live, Gobble Gait, and hosted National Night Out, bolstering our community engagement efforts more than ever. The Pink Patch Project netted \$800.00 for the American Cancer Society while the "Sound the Siren" campaign for the United Way's "Food for Kids Program" earned \$725.00 and over 2600 food items.







2021 Neighboring Cities Population (2020 U.S. Census Data)






