OUT OF BOUNDS

OUT OF BOUNDS

If any area of Out of Bounds (OB) is visible between the disc and OB line, then the disc is considered OB and the player must take an extra stroke. A throw that lands out of bounds must be played from a point 1 meter (3ft 3in) in bounds from where the disc went OB or from the previous lie. OB areas include the parking lot and main road (18ft Street) and crossing over the fence along the right side of #4 fairway.

Remain quiet and avoid unnecessary movements while others are throwing.
